PSW Teleconference Call Report

CUPE held a conference call for PSWs Feb. 18. We reviewed some of the problems with the new regulatory body for PSWs, including:

- -no PSWs on its board
- -PSWs have no influence on how much its fees will be
- -PSWs are subject to arbitrary loss of right to practice

PSWs are denied the right to appeal to the courts

We are in the process of setting up a meeting with the new agency.

Once we have had that meeting we will schedule another PSW call.

CUPE Local 5441 Fights a \$60 million deficit at UHT

Unity Health Toronto has a deficit of \$60 million and is looking to cut hundreds of vacant positions. Like all hospitals it is not funded for all of its operating costs, while it deals with a surge in demand from an aging, growing population.

A media conference was held during the provincial election, to call for full funding. CUPE 5441, which represents 4,000 staff at the 3 UHT hospitals, kicks off a campaign on March 14, which will include buttons, postcards to the Premier, a rally April 3 and advertising.



Community fights the closure of inpatient beds at Thessalon Hospital

Thessalon, a community of 1,500 people 90 km east of Sault Ste. Marie is a community in crisis.

The community hospital, with its ER and in-patient beds has been closed.

The community held a large public meeting February 8 and a major rally, February 19, at which 1/10th of the community came out to rally at the hospital and to march to Highway 17 to demand the re-opening of the hospital.

A second demonstration is planned in April.
